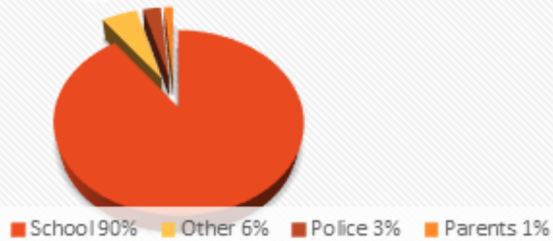


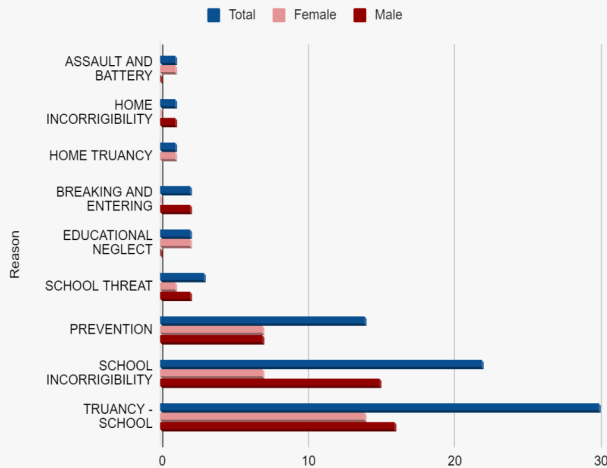
## CASEWORK SERVICES

HAYA provides confidential, short-term, family-centered counseling and referral services for young people, 17 years of age or younger, and their families, who live in the Holly Area School District. Referrals are accepted from schools, police, neighbors, community agencies, and parents. The Family Division's Intake Unit diverts cases when, in their judgment, Youth Assistance services are most appropriate. Typical reasons for referral include retail fraud, school/home issues, assault, substance abuse, and violations of local ordinances.

## JACOBSON-QUINN TOY PROJECT

Dick Jacobson (a former HAS teacher) and Doug Quinn (a former HAYA social worker) started this program in 1982 to ensure that every child in the Holly community receives a Christmas present. Generous donations of cash and toys from local citizens, Holly churches, area businesses, and civic organizations enabled HAYA to assist 374 children during this Christmas season. On December 17th eligible families picked up toys, wrapping paper, tape, stocking stuffers, and even family board games. Thank you to everyone who helped ensure this was an awesome holiday for all.

## SCHOOL SUPPLIES

HAYA prides itself on its School Supplies program. Qualifying students receive not only a quality backpack, but supplies that are specific to the school they attend and their current grade level. With help from the community, HAYA was able to provide 42 students with backpacks and school supplies valued at over \$100 to flourish successfully in Holly area schools this year.

## HAYA SCHOLARSHIP

2022 was the inception year of the new HAYA Scholarship. This \$500 scholarship was created to assist with the tuition of 2 local Holly students to continue their education at post-secondary institutions. Congratulations to our 2022 awardees; Ms. Ellie Butkovich (Cornell University) and Ms. Morgan Dudley (U of M Flint). HAYA wishes you the very best in your future endeavors.



## FAMILY EDUCATION

HAYA again provided a "Love and Logic" parenting program free of charge to our Holly area parents. This program teaches how to avoid power struggles and develop happy and responsibly empowered children. This effective 4-week class was offered online with 5 Holly Area participants in October of 2022.

## SKILL BUILDING

The Skill Building program provides scholarships to qualified Holly area students which encourages their participation in sports and recreational activities where the cost would be a prohibiting factor. This scholarship was awarded to 44 local Holly students enabling them to participate in programs like music, art, and extracurricular learning such as AP Exams, credit recovery, and even Driver's Education. The total amount HAYA awarded in 2022 was \$5,564.

## CAMP

Although various summer camps were up and running in 2022, HAYA did not receive any requests for overnight camping this year.

## MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS

The HAYA Musical Instruments Program is made possible through generous donations of band instruments to our program. Music participation is linked to higher teen academic achievement. This year HAYA added a saxophone and a coronet to its list of available band instruments. Currently, 14 eligible Holly area students have instruments on loan.



## FUNDRAISING

HAYA utilized 3 fundraising methods totaling \$2,665.00. Thank you to attendees at our two euchre parties which yielded \$1,596.00 and gloves sold at the Dickens Festival brought in \$131.00. Wednesday's car show popcorn sales earned an impressive \$938.00.

## YOUTH RECOGNITION

HAYA's Youth Recognition program acknowledges and celebrates students that make exemplary contributions to our community or have demonstrated personal achievement outside of academics and sports. Seven high school-aged honorees were represented and nominated in 2022.
